PROJECT SANCTIONED

The West White Rose Project was officially sanctioned on June 23, 2017. The contract for the Concrete Gravity Structure (CGS) has been awarded to a general partnership between SNC-Lavalin-Dragados-Pennecon (SDP) and will be constructed in Argentina. Early works are currently underway at the Argentina site with construction expected to start in 2018. The living quarters contract has been awarded to Kiewit Offshore Services in Marystown, and the Topsides contract has been awarded to Kiewit Offshore Services in Ingleside, Texas.

FUN FACTS ABOUT THE
**ARGENTIA
GRAVING
DOCK**

The Argentia site is located **130 km** from St. John's

Construction of the graving dock was completed in **May 2015**

The site was a former military base that was first occupied in **1941**; some remnants remain including old runways, buildings and bunkers

The dock has a depth of approximately **25 m** and the dock floor area is approximately **26,000 m²**

Approximately **1,400,000 m³** of materials were excavated during construction of the dock

The dock is kept in a dry state; around **400 litres** per second of ground water is pumped from **42** dewatering wells


